FIRST THINGS FIRST by Consumed by Fire

MEDITATION: Imagine if God showed up and said, "What do you want? Ask, and I'll give it to you." How would you answer? Most of us would ask for loved ones' safety, enough money to meet our needs, or a long, healthy life.Do you remember King Solomon? Solomon may have been tempted to name something similar—but he made a different request.

What he wanted was an understanding heart – wisdom – so he could serve God's people well. Solomon's life was full of personal needs and desires not so different from our own. But when given the opportunity to ask God for anything, he prioritized the Lord's concerns. God was so pleased with the request that Solomon not only given wisdom, but riches and honour as well! This reminds us of Jesus' words in the Gospel of Matthew: "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be provided to you."

Now God won't necessarily give wealth, influence, or long life, but God will always be faithful to provide all we need, according to God's purposes. Solomon's heart was set on seeking God's kingdom and righteousness, and the Lord honored that in a multitude of ways—both tangible and intangible. When we make God's priorities ours, I believe that's when God can truly work in our lives. When I was little, we learned a Sunday School song called JOY.

JESUS first, **O**THERS second, and **Y**OURSELF last.

Pretty simplistic, but still pretty good priorities.
